## Military police enforce driving ban in snow-stricken Buffalo

State and military police were sentyesterday to keep people off Buffalo's snow-choked roads, and officials kept counting fatalities three days after western New York's deadliest storm in at least two generations. Even as suburban roads and most major highways in the area reopened, Eric County Executive Mark Poloncarz warned that police would be stationed at entrances to Buffalo and at major intersections because some driving within New York's secondomic than 100 people are reported to have died in the region, officials said, including seven storm-related deaths announced yesterday by Buffalo Mayor Byron Brown's office. Greg Monett turned to social media to beg for help shovelling a 6-foot (1.8-metre) pile of snow from the end of his Buffalo drive-way so he could get dialysis

treatment yesterday.

"This has been a nightmare,"
he said in an interview Monday.

his family's home, he said, so relatives ran a gas stove to keep warm, a practice he acknowledged was dangerous. We had to do what we had to do," said Monett, 43. "We would have frozen to death in here." His loved ones called 911 when his blood sugar dipped dangerously low and he nearly passed out Sunday night, but they were told it would take hours to get to the home. Monett hours to get to the home, Monett said. He eventually recovered on his own.

Officials have said at news briefings that it was impossible to respond to emergency calls at the time.

Monett ultimately made it to dialysis after climbing through the snow and having neighbours help dig out his buried vehicle, sister Maria Monett said.

A Facebook group originally created in 2014, when Buffalo was buried under deep snow, has become a lifeline, seeking food, help thousands seeking food, medicine, shelter and rescue in the latest storm. Currently managed by five women, the group the latest storm. Currently man-aged by five women, the group swelled to at least 68,000 people as of yesterday. "We are seeing a lot of desper-ation," said Erin Aquilinia, founder of the original group, in an online interview.

The National Weather Service predicted that as much as 2 inches (2.5 to 5 centimetres) more snow could fall Tuesday in Eric County, which includes Buffalo and its 275,000 residents. County Emergency Services Commissioner Dan Neaverth Jr. said officials also were somewhat concerned about possible flooding later in the week when milder weather begins melting the snow.



#### Heavy rain, flood leave 29 dead in Philippines

Heavy rains and floods that devastated parts of the Philip-pines over the Christmas weekend have left at least 29 dead and 25 missing, the na-tional disaster response agen-cy said today. More than 86,000 people were still in emergency shel-ters after head weather dis-

More than 86,000 people were still in emergency shel-ters after bad weather dis-rupted Christmas celebra-tions in the eastern, central and southern Philippines. Images from the southern province of Misamis Occiden-tal showed rescuers carrying an elderly woman on a plastic chair as they would through a Housel with the control of the Housel with the control of the con-trol of flooded street. Some resi-dents in the province were seen hanging on to floaters as coast guard rescuers pulled them across chest-deep floods using a rope. Eighteen of the 29 deaths were reported in the Northern Mindanao region, while 12 of the 25 missing were from

the 28 missing were from Eastern Wasyns in the central Philippines, the National Disaster Risks Reduction and Management Council said. Most of the deaths were from drowning while among the missing were fishermen whose boats capsized, the agency said.

Over 3,200 houses were damaged by the floods along with roads and bridges, and some areas were without power or water, the agency reported.

A shear line — the point where warm and cold air meet — triggered rains in parts of the country, the state weather bureau said. A new low pressure area may bring moderate to heavy rains with-in the next 24 hours to the same areas affected by the floods, it said. on women

**UN calls on Taliban** 

to drop restraints

The UN Security Council yesterday decried increasing restrictions on women's rights in Afghanistan, urging the country's Taliban rulers to reverse them immediately.

The Security Council "retierated its deep concern of the suspension of schools beyond the sixth grade, and its call for the full, equal, and meaningful participation of women and girls in Afghanistan," it said in a press statemen.

UN High Commissioner for Human Rights Volker Türk pointed to "terrible consequences" of a decision bar women from

consequences" of a deci-sion to bar women from working for non-govern-mental organisations. Last week, Taliban au-thorities stopped university education for women, sparking international out-rage and demonstrations in Afghan cities. On Saturday, they an-nounced the seculusion of

On Saturday, they an-nounced the exclusion of women from NGO work, a move that already has prompted four major inter-national aid agencies to suspend operations in Af-ordanistan

suspens operating ghanistan.

"No country can develop—indeed survive—socially and economically with half its population excluded," Türk said in a statement issued in Geneva.

neva. These unfathomable restrictions placed on women and girls will not only in-crease the suffering of all Afghans but, I fear, pose a risk beyond Afghanistan's borders."

"This latest decree by the de facto authorities will have terrible consequences for women and for all Afghan people," Tirk said, adding that banning women from working for NGOs will deprive them and their families of incomes and of the right to "contribute positively" to the country's development.
"The ban will significantly impair, if not destroy, the capacity of these NGOs to deliver the essential services on which so many vulnerable Afghans depend," he said.

e said. Despite initially promising a more moderate rule respecting rights for wom-en and minorities when they took power last year, the Taliban have widely implemented their strict in terpretation of Islamic law

or Sharia.

They have banned girls from middle school and high school, restricted women from most employment and ordered them to wear head-to-toe clothing in public. "Women and girls cannot be denied their inherent rights," Türk said. "Attempts by the de facto authorities to relegate them to silence and invisibility will not succeed — it will merely harm all Afghans, compound their suffering, and impede the country's development."

# Vatican says health of retired pope Benedict XVI 'worsening'

The health of Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI has worsened due to his age, and doctors are constantly monitoring the frail 95-year-old's condi-tion, the Vatican said today.

Vatican spokesperson Matteo Bruni said Pope Francis, who asked the faith-ful earlier today to pray for Benedict, went to visit his predecessor in the monas-tery on Vatican grounds where the retired pontiff has lived since retiring in Febru-

#### **Chechens in Bosnia seek** to dodge Russian draft

Japon ennic Chechens fleeing Russia arrived in Bosnia this week, hoping to use the Balkan country as a launchpad to reach the Eu-ropean Union and avoid getting sent to fight in Ukraine. A group of ethnic Chechens fleeing Russia arrived in

The group of some 50 people, predominantly from Russia's Chechnya region, congregated near Bosnia's northwestern border with EU-member Croatia, the Bosnian Security Ministry said today. They want to reach the European Union because in their Union because, in their own words, they are fleeing military draft" in Russia, the ministry said. Russians can enter Bosnia without a risa and are permitted to tay in the country for a

maximum of 90 days within a 180-day period. But to enter Croatia, which is set to join Europe's visa-free travel zone, the Schengen travel zone, the Schengen Area, on Jan. closed off previously established migration paths in
the region.

The Krajina region, which lies partly along a highly porous segment of Bosnia's border with Croa-Bosnia's border with Croatia, has struggled for years to accommodate transient migrants and refugees, at times leaving thousands of people to sleep outside without access to food, heat or medical care.
