Each page of the proposal should be stamped and signed. All these three (3) envelopes then should be kept in **another envelop sealed with wax** (*laha chhap*).

# Background on Save the Children

# Background information/context of the Project

MOMENTUM Country and Global Leadership (MCGL) is a five-year global project (2019-2024) funded by the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) to provide targeted maternal, newborn and child health, family planning and reproductive health (MNCH/FP/RH) technical and capacity development assistance (TCDA) to countries to facilitate countries' journeys to sustainable development. MCGL also aims to contribute to global technical leadership and learning, and USAID's policy dialogue for achievement of global MNCH/FP/RH goals through support to globally endorsed MNCH/FP/RH initiatives, strategies, frameworks, guidelines, and action plans.



# In collaboration with Family Welfare Division (FWD), Ministry of Health and Population (MOHP) of Nepal, USAID/Nepal and national stakeholders, MCGL supported the review and adaptation of the 2020 WHO Standards for improving QoC for small and/or sick newborns (SSNB)s in health facilities leading to the development of the Nepal specific model of highquality nurturing care for SSNBs.

MCGL is now supporting FWD to pilot the Nepal Specific Small and Sick Newborn Model of Care in 4 Level II Health Facilities to learn from the process and to further refine the model for nationwide scale up. The piloting will be in the form of an implementation research wherein MCGL will first conduct a Health Facility Assessment to assess the readiness of the pilot sites in each of the 10 components of the model prior to the piloting the interventions of the model. MCGL is hiring a consultant to review and fine tune the HFA and the proposal to be submitted to Nepal Health Research Council (NHRC). The Health Facility Assessment tool and proposal will be validated by FWD and the Technical Working Group (TWG) as well as key stakeholders prior to being ready for use in the pilot.

# Goal

The goal of this activity is to support the development of the HFA tool and the methodological section of proposal for the piloting of the Nepal Specific SSNB model of care.

# Objectives

The objectives of this consultancy are to:

- Review the existing HFA tools for Small and Sick Newborn, prepare and share the draft as per 10 WHO components, incorporate comments and finalize the HFA tool
- Ensure all the 10 components are well covered through the assessment questions and those are well arranged ensuring logical flow with necessary guidelines enclosed (Component wise question modules)
- Ensure questionnaire is methodologically sound and each question is designed with appropriate technique and language.
- Consult with the MCGL team to finalize the draft
- Pre-test questionnaire in a health facility coordinating with MCGL team
- Prepare the final draft of HFA tool including a brief report of development methods and learning.
- Support MCGL to finalize the NHRC proposal, especially methodological section and ensure its synchronization with the HFA tool.

# Location and official travel involved:

The consultant will work remotely, with visits to the SCI country office in Kathmandu and attend in-person meetings with FWD, experts and other key stakeholders as appropriate. The consultant will also attend virtual meetings with the headquarters team. The consultant may need to travel within Kathmandu Valley only. SCI will also be covering all the in-person meetings/workshops related expenses including the logistics required.

• Collaborating with the MCGL Nepal and Headquarters teams, FWD, TWG, and subject matter experts to support the development, review and field test Health Facility Assessment tool and NHRC proposal
