Terms of Reference (ToR)

I. Background on Save the Children

Save the Children is the leading global independent organisation for children. Save the Children believes every child deserves a future. 2. Background information/context of the Project

MOMENTUM Country and Global Leadership (MCGL) is a five-year global project funded by the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID) to provide targeted maternal, newborn and child health, family planning and reproductive health (MNCH/FP/RH) technical and capacity development assistance (TCDA) to countries to facilitate countries' journeys to sustainable development. MCGL also aims to contribute to global technical leadership and learning, and USAID's policy dialogue for achievement of global MNCH/FP/RH goals through support to globally endorsed MNCH/FP/RH initiatives, strategies, frameworks, guidelines, and action plans.

In collaboration with Family Welfare Division (FWD), Ministry of Health and Population (MOHP) of Nepal, USAID/Nepal and national stakeholders, MCGL aims to support the review and adoption of WHO Small and Sick Newborn (SSNB) Quality of Care (QoC) standards leading to defining of a model of high-quality nurturing care for small and/or sick newborn. Subsequently, the model will be tested to



generate learning that will contribute to scale up of improved care of small and/or sick newborn in Nepal. Earlier in 2018, Family Welfare Division, with support from the USAID funded Maternal and Child Health Program had undertaken a Situation Analysis of Small and Sick Newborn in Nepal¹. The report captured information on policies, implementation strategies, service readiness and health systems related to inpatient care of newborn and young infants (0-59 days). It also provided detailed information on services provided by 17 government and private health facilities from seven provinces in the country.

To support FWD and other relevant stakeholders in newborn health to define the necessary health systems and nurturing care elements of the model of small and/or sick newborn care, MCGL plans to conduct a desk review on the current policies, strategies, and guidelines on Small and Sick Newborn Care in Nepal. The desk review analysis framework will be guided by the eight quality of care standards and the quality aims set by WHO on Small and Sick Newborns² and the components of WHO universal model of small and / or sick newborn care. Save the Children calls for a competent consultant to provide a proposal for this desk review consultancy, in which the consultant will clearly outline how he/she intends to undertake this work with clear timelines.

2.1 General Objective

The objective of this consultancy is:

To conduct a desk review to develop a document that summarizes and compares current policies, strategies, and guidelines on Small and Sick Newborn Care in Nepal against the quality of care standards set by WHO on Small and Sick Newborns.

2.2 Specific Objectives

- 1. To review the existing policies, strategies, and guidelines on Small and Sick Newborn Care in Nepal.
- 2. To work in an analytical framework that allows for the comparison of current SSNC implementation guidelines against the WHO QoC SSNC standards
- 3. To analyze and identify the gaps in the policies/strategies/guidelines and practices on Small and Sick Newborn Care in Nepal as they relate to the WHO SSNB QoC standards.
- Facilitate a workshop to collect practices from experts in the field

3. Methodology

It is expected that the consultant should use appropriate methods for the desk review in which the consultant should extract information from the existing policies & strategies, secondary data, grey paper literature, government protocols & guidelines, and collect perspectives on the current implementation contexts. For information not available online, books /papers, the consultant should collect additional information through consultation with key stakeholders. The consultant may have to reach out (in person or virtually) to relevant government/non-governmental officials for any background or additional information on the Small and Sick Newborn Care if required. Apart from

frequent communication with Nepal MCGL team, the consultant may also need to talk to MCGL Headquarter colleagues in Washington through virtual platform when required.

4. Location and official travel involved

The consultant will work from his/her home or personal space and need not have to travel to SC offices. Save the Children will not provide any space and the equipment for delivering these services. SC will not cover additional cost/expenses for the travel that might be required for the consultation with concerned stakeholders.

5. Estimated Timelines

The estimated working day for this assignment is 30 days, which is spread over 2 months after the day of contract. The consultant will perform the following activities during the consultancy period.

- 1. List and review relevant documents, prepare a general review report and submit to Hiring manager for inputs and approval (10 days)
- 2. Populate the findings and compare them with WHO SSNB Quality of Care Standards through the analytical framework and submit the draft to Hiring manager (12 days)
- 3. Receive feedback, incorporate feedback, prepare final report and presentation based on the review/comments/feedback from FWD and/or TWG (7 days)
- 4. Present findings including recommendations on gaps and opportunities to FWD and Newborn TWG for inputs (1 days)
