Terms of Reference (ToR)

Background on Save the Children:

Save the Children believes every child deserves a future. Background information / Context

In 2015, Member States of United Nations adopted the 2030 agenda on sustainable development which incorporates the sustainable development goals. The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are a set of seventeen interlinked goals that serve as a shared blueprint for 5 Ps; *People*: the wellbeing of all people, *Planet*: protection of the earth's ecosystems, *Prosperity*: continued economic & technological growth, *Peace*: securing peace, and *Partnership*: improving international cooperation. The SDGs put the onus on all individuals and countries to work together for a prosperous and sustainable future leaving no one behind. The goals and the progress in achieving them has a great impact on the future of children and the world they will live in. All seventeen goals are related to children's issues and have direct linkages on children's rights that are enshrined in the United Nations Convention on the rights of the child (UNCRC).

The Government of Nepal has developed a Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) roadmap and set country-specific targets to meet the SDGs by 2030. As a part of the Voluntary National Review (VNR), Nepal presented its <u>first report in 2017</u> and <u>second in 2020</u>. We have recently crossed the



mid-term of SDGs implementation, and a crucial time to reflect back and look forward to achieving the goals and targets. <u>Nepal intends to present its third VNR</u> during the High-Level Political Forum on Sustainable Development to be held in July 2024. Children's rights cannot be overlooked on achieving the SDGs and children's agenda should be the utmost priority to sustain the achievement beyond 2030. Children's perspective should be considered crucial and mandatory for SDGs implementation, review, and reporting.

As a global child rights organization, Save the Children promotes children's leadership, voice, and agency in every aspect to achieve the highest attainable rights of children through the SDGs. In this context, Save the Children is looking forward to a collaborative model of working with children and civil society organizations to conduct a mid-term review of the SDGs implementation (01 January 2016 – 30 September 2023) with children's perspectives and prepare a report focusing on children's constituencies on the SDGs. The report should contribute to the supplementary report of Voluntary National Review. For this, Save the Children calls for the Consultants or Consulting Firm to undertake the assignment.

Objective:

The Consultant(s) / consulting firm is expected to conduct a review and prepare a report with an analysis of each of the SDGs from a child-centered and intersectionality approach highlighting the perspectives of children most impacted by inequality and discrimination. The report is expected to serve as the supplementary report to the Voluntary National Reviews.

Study Design

The proposed assignment will conduct literature review from existing and credible sources, consultations, focus group discussions and validation with civil society organizations and children. An analysis of policies, programs and plans related to children and SDGs will also be incorporated. The report structure will be discussed and agreed together.

Ethical considerations:

- Child participatory and child led. Where appropriate and safe, children should be supported to participate in the research process beyond simply being respondents. It will also be ensured that FGDs with children will be child friendly and child-led. Opportunities for collaborative participation could include involving children in determining success criteria against which the project could be evaluated, supporting children to collect some of the data required for the evaluation themselves, or involving children in the validation of findings. Any child participation, whether consultative, collaborative or child-led, must abide by the <u>9 Basic Requirements for meaningful and ethical child participation</u>.
- **Inclusive**. Ensure that children from different ethnic, social, and religious backgrounds have the chance to participate, as well as children with disabilities and children who may be excluded or discriminated against in their community.
- **Ethical**: The study must be guided by the following ethical considerations:
 - Safeguarding demonstrating the highest standards of behaviour towards children and adults.
 - Sensitive to child rights, gender, inclusion and cultural contexts.



- Openness of information given, to the highest possible degree to all involved parties.
- Public access to the results when there are not special considerations against this.
- Broad participation the relevant parties should be involved where possible.
- Reliability and independence the study should be conducted so that findings and conclusions are correct and trustworthy.

It is expected that:

- Data collection methods will be age and gender appropriate.
- Study activities will provide a safe, creative space where children feel that their thoughts and ideas are important.
- A risk assessment will be conducted that includes any risks related to children.
- A referral mechanism will be in place in case any child safeguarding or protection issues arise.

Services the Supplier will provide

The Consultant(s) / consulting firm will propose a review design, methodology, child participation approach, timeframe, and reporting outlook and secure any prior consent as required for data collection and review of SDGs. The Consultant(s) / consulting firm is expected to coordinate with National Planning Commission, Provincial Planning Commission, relevant ministries (MoWCSC, MoEST, MoFAGA, MoHP, MoHA), National Child Rights Council, and civil society organizations including Nepal SDGs Forum, and children's groups etc. to ensure that a comprehensive and inclusive perspective is included in the study. Organizations directly working on the rights of children, particularly focused on girls, children with disabilities, children with diverse SOGIESC, Dalit children, children of ethnic and indigenous minorities etc and children from the mentioned group/community should be consulted / engage during the process. The consultant/consulting firm should produce a full review report, child-friendly version of summary report, along with briefs and infographics materials based on the report.

Key deliveries:

- Literature Review on the progress, achievements and challenges of SDGs and children related goals and targets. Review of legislation, policies and plans related to governments commitment to achieving these goals.
- Conduct consultation workshops and key informant interviews in provincial (Madhesh and Karnali) and federal level (Kathmandu).
- Prepare and design a full review report that feed-in to the supplementary report to VNR.
- Prepare, design, and print a child-friendly version as a summary report.
- Prepare and Design briefs and infographics materials from the report as content for social media and website.

Proposal requirement:

- Detailed methodology and study plan including proposed way of making the study childinformed/led.
- Prior work establishing strong knowledge and experience on related study, report writing and child participation.



- Study timeline highlighting review, consultation, KIIs, report write-up, design and publication.

Experience and Skill set Requirement:

Essential:

- Team leader should have 3+ years of experience in undertaking research or evidencebased advocacy on SDGs, child rights, child participation etc.

Preferred:

- Experience working with I/NGOs on similar issues.

Supervision: The consultant / consulting firm will work closely with Save the Children's ACCM team in Country Office (Kathmandu) and field offices (Bardibaas and Surkhet).
